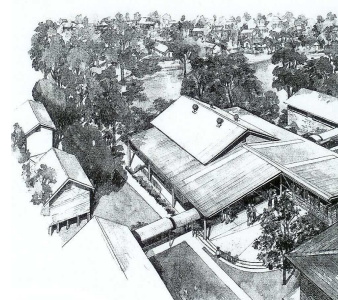

All student Commonwealth Banking will be banked on a Tuesday. Students are able to leave their bank books at the front office.

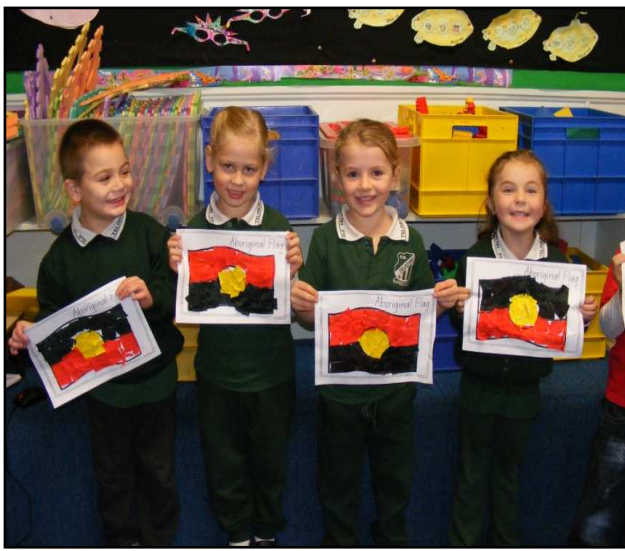
GOODBYE TELARAH PUBLIC
